



## Cookie Policy

Amended 7th March 2017

### 1. Cookies Overview

---

Wintercorn's own websites are defined as any website operated by Wintercorn Consulting Limited for its own purposes. Client websites should be covered by their own cookies policy and Wintercorn are not responsible for the cookie policies of websites not owned or operated by us.

Our websites use cookies for collecting non personal user information from the site, we do not collect any information about you except that required for system administration of each website.

Cookies are pieces of data created when you visit a site, and contain a unique, anonymous number. They are stored in the cookie directory of your hard drive, and do not expire at the end of your session.

A cookie will typically contain the name of the domain from which the cookie has come; the lifetime of the cookie; and a value, usually a randomly generated unique number.

Cookies do not contain any personal information about you and cannot be used to identify an individual user. If you choose not to accept the cookie, this will not affect your access to the majority of facilities available on our websites.

Although your browser may be set up to allow the creation of cookies, you can specify that you be prompted before a site puts a cookie on your hard disk, so that you can decide whether to allow or disallow the cookie. Alternatively, you can set your computer not to accept any cookie.

We use analytics programs to gather non-personal data regarding the visitors to our site on our behalf using cookies and code embedded in the site. Both the cookies and the embedded code provide non-personal statistical information about visits to pages on the site, the duration of individual page view, paths taken by visitors through the site, data on visitors' screen settings and other general information.

The Wintercorn systems administration team uses this type of information, as with that obtained from any other cookies used on the site, to help us improve the service to our users and the efficiency and security of our systems.

## 2. Blocking Our Cookies

---

Wintercorn does not use cookies to collect personally identifiable information about you. However, if you wish to restrict or block the cookies which are set by our websites, or indeed any other website, you can do this through your browser settings. The Help function within your browser will tell you how to do this.

Alternatively, you may wish to visit [www.aboutcookies.org](http://www.aboutcookies.org) which contains comprehensive information on how to do this on a wide variety of browsers. You will also find details on how to delete cookies from your machine as well as more general information about cookies.

Please be aware that restricting cookies may impact or reduce the functionality of our websites.

If you wish to view the information contained in your cookie, just click on a cookie to open it. You'll see a short string of text and numbers. The numbers are your identification card, which can only be seen by the server that gave you the cookie. Some cookies expire as soon as you leave the website and some last for several months or years.

For information on how to do this on the browser of your mobile phone you will need to refer to your handset manual.

## 3. Cookies set by Third Parties

---

We sometimes embed photos and video content from websites such as YouTube and Flickr. As a result, when you visit a page with content embedded from, for example, YouTube or Flickr, you may be presented with cookies from these websites. Wintercorn does not control the dissemination or operation of these cookies.

You should with check the third party websites for more information about their own cookies.
